News to share:

- For several years, we have made a concerted effort to support students who are exploring different majors and minors. These students have a dedicated academic advisor (Will Weldon), a Living-Learning Community, and targeted marketing materials available to them all in an effort to remove the negative stigma previously associated with being 'Undecided.' Last fall, an Exploratory Studies Program was developed to further this cause. Exploratory Studies better reflects the process that students go through as they explore their own strengths and interests as well as the programs of study we offer. There is no cost associated with the change of name from Undecided to Exploratory Studies.
- Once again, SU's Global Seminar program is providing world-class high-impact field-based learning all over the
 world during this January term. Fourteen faculty members are teaching 140 students in eight countries on four
 continents. This year students are studying in Africa, Asia, Europe, and Latin America. Many thanks to the faculty
 members who are providing this global learning experience for our students.
- As you know, each semester the University hosts countless cultural, scholarly, and artistic events, many of which are listed in Panorama each semester. **Panorama for Spring 2020** will soon be posted <u>online</u> as appropriate, please share events with your students or consider including some of these in your courses.

Funding and development opportunities:

- Applications for The SU Foundation, Inc. **Professional Development Grant** program are being accepted until 1/17/20. The <u>SUF Professional Development Grant program</u> supports conference travel for the presentation of papers, posters or performances at regional, national or international conferences and venues; research activities; creative activity; attendance at regional, national or international conferences and seminars; and activities improving the quality of life in this community.
- The SU Faculty Mini-Grant Program provides awards up to \$3,000 to encourage faculty to develop research, scholarly, or creative programs that provide the potential for sustained professional development and extramural

support. Additionally, the program is intended to support faculty in areas that traditionally have difficulty securing funding to increase their research and scholarly activities output. Proposals to this program are encouraged from all five academic units and the Library. An official program announcement is forthcoming on 2/1/20 and applications are due on 2/28/20; contact Teri Herberger for more information.
