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Happy new year and apologies for the day-late First Monday email; that may be par for the course in 2021! I hope you had a peaceful, healthy and rejuvenating holiday break.

Good news to share:

- Please join me in congratulating your colleagues whose outstanding work was recognized with the SU Alumni Association Faculty Appreciation Award at our 2020 Commencement Exercises last month:

- I'm happy to report that in a survey of student experiences last fall here at SU, 2/3 of respondents indicated that faculty were very accessible and 44% reported that their courses were very challenging.
- With the budget picture looking slightly more promising, we invite sabbatical applications for the Fall 2021 semester from eligible faculty. Given continued budget constraints, we may not be able to fund all eligible applicants, but would like to fund as many endorsed applications as possible.

- Keep an eye out for a call for applications from the Office of Graduate Studies &
 Research for funding opportunities that will be available this spring for undergraduate
 (USARA grants) and graduate students (RAP grants) and faculty (Building Research
 Excellence (BRE), Research Mini-grants).
- ID&D is happy to announce that Respondus lockdown browser is now available for Chromebooks. Please see the ID&D KnowledgeBase for information.

COVID-19 Information and plans for the spring semester are still under development, please keep an eye out for updates.

- Plans continue to be developed for Winter Term and Spring Semester testing regimes. All students and University employees returning to campus this month are expected to be tested within 7 days of their return to campus.
- Prox (Gull Card) access will be required for entry into all buildings over winter session to
 minimized entry by the general public. Students and University employees should be
 able to gain access to University buildings unless they are medically not cleared or do not
 have a negative test on record within the required time frame. The front entrance of
 Holloway Hall and the first floor entrances of the Commons are open.
- For the spring semester, we anticipate requiring negative test results of students who live on campus to be received prior to their return to residence halls. We also anticipate increasing testing requirements.
- In December, Governor Hogan issued an emergency order requiring Marylanders to limit all travel to essential purposes only. All Marylanders who travel outside of Maryland or any individuals who travel to Maryland must either obtain a negative COVID-19 test result (must quarantine while waiting for the result) or self-quarantine for 10 days. This applies to all states, with the exception of DE, PA, VA, WV, and DC. Campus visitors from most states (not those listed previously) need to provide proof of a negative test result within 72 hours prior to arrival on campus to participate in any University sponsored functions and/or to enter campus buildings.
- <u>COVID-19 testing</u> continues this month. Campus community members who are considered at high-risk or who live with those who are should feel free to contact Campus Health at <u>campushealth@salisbury.edu</u> or 410-677-0006 for assistance with parking or scheduling a testing time reserved for high-risk individuals.
