Greetings Colleagues: Although it's hard to believe, we are just four weeks from the start of the fall semester. I know how much effort goes into preparing for the upcoming academic year and want to thank all of you for your hard work and resilience. We hope the upcoming year is much more typical than the last and are planning for regular classroom densities, largely face-to-face instruction and experiential learning, cultural events, athletics, and many other activities.

As noted in the calendar below, the last full week of August will be a busy one for faculty, staff and incoming students alike. Please plan to participate in these events as possible.

Projects Underway and Good News to Share

- Last August in our First Monday email, I noted that we had earned the largest indirects from grants of all time in the previous academic year. I'm delighted to share that we've blown by that record, with \$595.7K in indirect cost recovery (nearly 5% more than last year). Indirect funds are reinvested in research, graduate education, faculty development, and other programs. My thanks to all of you who have continued to work on proposals despite these challenging times. Thanks as well to our colleagues in the Office of Sponsored Programs for their expertise and commitment to supporting your work.
- Thanks to Andrew Martino (Honors), Chrys Egan (Fulton), Lauren Hill (Honors), Ryan Weaver (PACE and Interdisciplinary Studies), Catherine Jackson (Interdisciplinary Studies), Dan Harris (Geography), Gina Bloodworth (Geography and Environmental Studies), Blossom Thao (Housing and Residence Life), Beth Ragan (History/Anthropology), and Creston Long, Ian Post, and Jennifer Piegols (Nabb Center) for developing *SU Place as Text* for incoming students (to be held on 8/29). *Place as Text* sets the stage for a small group to explore a place by "reading" and "mentally mapping" what they discover through observing, listening, and reflecting. *SU Place as Text* offers thematic walking routes: Salisbury University Campus and Downtown Salisbury.
- Congratulations to Crystal Kelly (Director, SU Publications) who recently received one of the University System of Maryland's highest honors: the Board of Regents' Staff Award for Effectiveness and Efficiency. In addition to managing costs and raising efficiency within the Publications Office, Crystal tirelessly supports effective and visually-interesting communication across campus, literally from COVID to Commencement.
- <u>Gull Week</u> will run in-person 9/13-9/20 and provides important information regarding the effectiveness of our undergraduate academic programs. Please encourage your students to participate and click <u>here</u> to see summaries of previous assessments.

Training and Reporting Requests

- As noted in several emails from the Office of Information Technology, GullNet was upgraded on August 1 and has a new look (but same functionality). For more information, see Getting Started with the GullNet 2021 Upgrade.
- Last year above 85% of faculty completed the Annual Survey of Faculty Productivity. This year, the participation rate is only about 50%. As noted in previous First Monday and other emails, the mechanism used by the USM to measure faculty workload and productivity has changed.

It's critical that faculty complete the **Annual Survey of Faculty Productivity** to allow us to accurately describe, in aggregate, the outstanding work of SU faculty. Thanks to those of you who have completed the survey. If you haven't had a chance to complete this, the deadline has been extended to 8/15/21 (see 5/28/21 email from the Office of the Provost). Please email provost@salisbury.edu if you need the instructions on how to complete the survey in Digital Measures resent to you or if you have other questions.

- Before you know it, Advising season will be upon us. You can easily use Navigate to manage both your Program Planning appointments and Office Hours. To do so, you may need to re-sync your calendars so that Navigate "speaks to" Outlook and your true free times show-up as options. If you don't have a blue "Activate Office 365" button when attempting the first step, you should be good-to-go already. Directions were sent to you by your Advising Services Coordinator; please reach out to them with any questions.
- Registration for Faculty Development Day (August 25th) is open! Please plan to join us for sessions on 1) Launching a Center for Faculty Development & Excellence and 2) Student Learning Outcomes in General Education.

COVID 19-related updates

- Nearly 87% of SU Academic Affairs employees are fully vaccinated against COVID and this percentage is similarly high in other divisions.
- Campus Health continues to reach out to students to ask them to provide consent for the University to access their vaccination records but feels positive about the percentage of students who are already vaccinated.
- Although there are some dark clouds on the horizon (e.g., delta variant, breakthrough infections), the USM and Campus Health Team recommend continuing with the safety protocols already in place.
