Good news to share:

- Increasingly, **cultural events are being held on our campus** including live theatre (run of *Our Town* last month), speakers (<u>Andrea Pitzker</u> here on Thursday), Native American storytellers, and much more. The <u>University Events</u> calendar is a great resource to see what's coming up.
- Mike Lewis (Environmental Studies) will receive the 2021 John Groutt Award for Environmental Stewardship from the Wicomico Environmental Trust (WET). Congratulations as well to Earth Science major Allison Dreiss who won WET's Watershed Stewardship Award for 2021.
- The Bosserman Center for Conflict Resolution held the UN Regional Centre of Expertise Summit on 10/5-10/7 in which UN Directors from the Americas came together to share their progress. More than 500 participants from 30 countries were expected to attend. Congratulations to the Brian Polkinghorn, Brittany Foutz, and the RCE Team on this international convening.
- Chin-Hsiu Chen (Early & Elementary Education) was recently awarded a \$215K grant to support the coalescing of our current Lower Shore Child Care Resource Center with a similar center in the Upper Shore. It's anticipated that this project will lead to center that serves all eight counties on the Eastern Shore. Congratulations Chin-Hsiu!
- Congratulations to **Bill Burke** and the entire Entrepreneurship team which held the Shore Hatchery for the ninth year and awarded \$100K in prize money that is generously provided by the Ratcliffe Foundation. To date, this competition is responsible for nearly \$1.6M in startup investment resulting in 638 jobs created and millions in revenue.
- As noted in the 10/18 email from the President's Office, 'Make Tomorrow Yours' is the new brand representation for SU after more than a year of work by campus-wide team on this important part of our Strategic Plan.
