With apologies to Earth, Wind & Fire, Ba-de-ya! and welcome to the First Monday email for September. I hope your semester has launched well and that your students are settling in.

A major focus this fall will be on how we consider and recognize activities that support diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) in our tenure and promotion criteria. The Faculty Senate will be seeking your input to the recommendations (see attached) through school/college-level meetings to be held this semester. The Faculty Senate also plans to hold a campus-wide convening this semester. As noted in a recent <u>Chronicle of Higher Education article</u>, more than a quarter of public colleges have added DEI to their tenure standards and one half of institutions that do not currently have DEI criteria for tenure are considering adding them. We look forward to your thoughtful feedback regarding these recommendations.
