Greetings on Election 2022 Eve: My thanks to SU's Institute for Public Affairs and Civic Engagement (PACE) and others for their efforts to get out the vote this month. As noted in the email that Sandy Pope sent this morning, there are several resources available to help voters research the issues.

Good News to Share:

- Thank you and congratulations to the <u>General Education Oversight Committee</u>, its subcommittees, and the many faculty working on GE curriculum. A special shout-out as well to **Dave Johnson** (English) for his new course, *Storytelling in Cinema, Writing and Life*. This terrific proposal was the first First Year Seminar proposal approved by the GEOC. We are off and running!
- I'm delighted that Vanice Antrum has returned to SU to serve as Director of Multicultural Affairs. She's
 joined by Robby Chin who will be serving as program administrative specialist. Both Vanice and Robby
 are SU alumni and bring significant experience and energy to their roles in the Office of Diversity &
 Inclusion
- Three cheers for the <u>Saunterer</u>, the Clarke Honors College semi-annual publication. The Saunterer, written and edited by students, won (for the third time!), First Place in the National Collegiate Honors Council's Newsletter Contest.
- Now in its 10th year, the <u>Shore Hatchery</u> competition has invested nearly \$1.8M in Mid-Atlantic entrepreneurs and start-ups. This investment has generated 678 jobs and nearly \$98M in revenue. These amazing outcomes reflect a lot of passion and hard work. Congratulations to **Bill Burke and the entire** entrepreneurship team; they awarded another \$100,000 to competitors on October, 28th. And thanks to the Ratcliffe Foundation for their generous support of Shore Hatchery.
- And on November 4th, SU's Mid-Atlantic Sales and Marketing Institute (MASMI) held its Ad Challenge. Congratulations to Patrick Fennel, Amit Poddar, Irina Piatselchyts, Aaron Johnson, Argha Sen, Simba Pasirayi, Memo Diriker, and administrative assistant Kelly Hickey on what is quickly becoming a campus tradition.
- Several of your colleagues have won significant grant awards in the past few weeks. Althea Pennerman (Early & Elementary Education) and colleagues at Coppin State U. won a \$4.1M award from the U.S. Department of Education for their *Pathways to the Professions* program which aims to increase teacher diversity and student success in high-need urban and rural schools across Maryland. **David Weber** (Accounting) received a \$2.6 million grant from the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services for our Fraud & Forensic Accounting Certificate Program and to support SU students assisting Worcester County law enforcement officials in fighting elder financial and high-tech fraud. And **Debbie Webster** (Nursing) won a \$200,000 award from the Maryland Higher Education Commission to support four Nursing Faculty Fellows. Congratulations to Althea, David, Debbie, and to the hard-working team in the Office of Sponsored Research.
- Thanks to all the groups and organizations that came out for Homecoming and Family Weekend last
 month. The weather and atmosphere were great. Special appreciation to the faculty and students of <u>SU's</u>
 <u>Living Learning Communities</u>. It was great to learn about all the great LLC projects and activities
 including the <u>SU Phenology Project</u>.
- SU's undefeated **Field Hockey Team won the Coast to Coast Conference championship** on Saturday with a 2-0 win over Christopher Newport University. Congrats to Coach Dawn Chamberlin and the entire team.
- Our colleagues in Publications and Advancement won not one but two awards for SU's new brand campaign. *Make Tomorrow Yours* won a Hermes Creative Award from the Association of Marketing and Communication Professionals and Best Brand Launch from CASE (Council for the Advancement and Support of Education) District II.
- Kudos to all of our SU colleagues featured in "Silver Linings Faculty Showcase Proceeding," published

through the University System of Maryland: **Carolina Bown** (Communication), **Sarah Surak** (Political Science), **Chrys Egan** (Communication), **James Fox** (Education), **Joshua Sokoloski** and **Anita Brown** (Chemistry). Together, these essays help paint a picture of teaching and learning efforts that are flexible, creative, empathetic toward students, and inclusive of students' differing needs. Training, Opportunities, Resources and Reminders

- January is Gen-ed-uary this year! Plans are in the works for a full-day workshop (1/6/23) focused on creating new proposals for Gen Ed courses or realigning current Gen Ed courses for the COMAR categories. This workshop will emphasize course mapping, Curriculog, and departmental readiness. A refresher workshop will also be offered 1/20/23 for peer review and submission support. This session will help faculty create or realign Gen Ed courses for the COMAR categories. Participants* who successfully submit a proposal through Curriculog will received \$500 in travel funds (good through June 2025). (*Limited to participants who have not yet received funding for participation in professional development work related to Gen Ed). Registration will open this week.
