

- On November 27th, SU hosted the <u>Inaugural Interprofessional Symposium on Transgender Care and Experience</u>, which brought together faculty, staff, students, and community members to foster learning, support, and inclusivity for the transgender community. The event was made possible by the CHHS Interprofessional Education Fellowship granted to **Alison Sutton-Ryan** (Social Work), who is also the project lead of the SU Transgender Interprofessional Care Team (TICT).   supported Ashlynn as she prepared for this opportunity.
- The Maryland Higher Education Commission recently recognized faculty from the School of Nursing for their dedication to preparing future nurses. Huge congratulations to **Tina Reid** who earned the prestigious Nurse Faculty Annual Recognition Award for demonstrating excellence and impact. In addition, **Brooke** Mills, Mia Waldron, Stephanie Howard, and Annette Manson received the New Nurse Faculty Fellowship Award. Congratulations to these outstanding nurses educating the next generation!
- On November 13th, President Lepre held her second State of the University address, where she highlighted significant achievements and future plans for SU. These include the establishment of a graduate school, new academic programs in engineering, music therapy, and public communication, and expanded study abroad initiatives. The address also covered campus climate, mental health initiatives, and recent successes such as the new general education curriculum and a record-setting first-year class. - Also at the State of the University address, President Lepre announced the initial recipients of funding from SU's <u>Strategic Innovation funds</u>. These projects aim to increase innovation and student success and include funding for 1) faculty certification

in effective teaching practices, 2) establishment of the First Gen Sea Gull Scholars program, 3) establishment of a campus secondhand shop, 4) examining how to best help students transition off of academic probation, and 5) expansion of donor participation in flash fundraising.
